WHAT WE NEED ON JULY 3 - MONDAY

1 person to set up the tables and chairs - 2 could do it, but 3 is quicker & easier.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN BE BROUGHT TO THE CHURCH ANY TIME.....There will be someone at the church on Monday morning beginning at 9 a.m. until probably noon.

1 person to bring fruit - grapes, apples, oranges, etc.

7 folks to bring any of the following lunch meat (turkey, ham, tuna, roast beef, etc.) cheese, peanut butter, jelly, etc. This is for them to take on the road for lunches so they don't have to spend \$\$\$ on groceries which the money will come out of their donations for cancer research.

JULY 4 - TUESDAY

We need 5 more showers - don't want to have 5 bicylists going without one!!! 1 more to help make their dinner and do prep work for breakfast. 3 folks to help clean-up.

Bill, who is handing over the baked beans spoon to Leaf and Kathy, needs a respite from several years of preparing a huge serving of baked beans for the Homeless Potluck which our church provides the fourth Sunday every month. Following is the recipe he and Betty Humphrey used for what are claimed to be the best baked beans on the coast.

BETTY HUMPHREY & BILL KELLER'S BAKED BEANS

Brown and simmer in a large skillet:

- 3 lbs. lean ground meat
- 3 large onions chopped in a food processor
- 2 T. chopped garlic

Pour the juice out of the cans (or not) and combine in a large rectangular pan or roaster oven:

- 3 #10 cans pork & beans in tomato sauce (6 lbs. 12 oz. each can)
- 1 #10 can kidney beans
- 3 short cans (8.5 oz.) green lima beens if wanted

Then add to the pan or roaster oven:

Ground meat, onion, and garlic mixture

- 2 T. liquid smoke
- 2 t. hot pepper sauce
- 1 1/2 cups Smoky Cattleman's BBQ sauce
- 2 T. mustard or more
- 1 cup brown sugar or more

Stir all ingredients together

Bake in oven at 350 degrees for an hour or freeze the content and thaw and bake before serving.

DEACONS SPONSOR A FAMILY

July, 2017 will mark the first year anniversary for our church deacons sponsoring a family at Project Sanctuary. In June 2016, the head of Project Sanctuary presented a program for the Deacons explaining it's mission: to help people escaping domestic violence. It didn't take long for the Deacons to see a

place we thought we could make a difference for a needy family and the following month we budgeted \$600 of our annual budget to support a family. No, we do not know their names, but we are beginning to get a feel for this needy family.

Mom and two children, ages 11 and 9 last July, were victims of domestic violence. They came to Project Sanctuary for support and advice. Last summer we offered to pay for swimming lessons for the boy and a Hip Hop Class for the pre-teen girl at the Starr Center. Come September and school, we put a generous amount on a Kohl gift card for school clothes.

For Christmas, mom and two children each received a hand knit scarf and stocking cap, plus we spent about \$50 on each person in the family for something personal. The boy, turning ten in December, received a gift certificate from Out of this World in Mendocino. The girl received a gift certificate from the Gallery Books in Mendocino for her twelfth birthday.

The family counselor at Project Sanctuary has kept the Deacons in the loop: mom now has a full time job. The boy is particularly interested in cooking and has a mentor who is teaching him to cook. We make sure that cards are sent for birthdays, special holidays with a prayer and words of praise and encouragement from the "Deacons at the Presbyterian Church."

This June we are spending the last of our \$600 budget for a gift card so mom and kids can buy things needed for their home; much was trashed by the perpetrator before Project Sanctuary was contacted. The father of the children is being released from jail in six months.....another stress that comes to a family caught in these circumstances.

I am pleased that the Deacons are putting some prayers and support to cause that has the potential for success. Pat Long


October also has five Sundays; maybe pasta and beans? December has five Sundays too, maybe cereal?
