

After sending our MIF (Mission Information Form) which included our mission statement and other statistics about our church and community to the Redwoods Presbytery Committee on Ministry, our search for a new full-time pastor was sent out on the CLC (Church Leadership Connection) Call System for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) On that website our church can be viewed by pastors who might be interested in pursuing a call to become our next pastor.

Our PNC, which meets weekly, has begun to receive email PIF's (Professional Information Files) from those pastors interested in learning more about, or in applying to become our next full time minister. As PNC Chairperson Nancy Jorgensen keeps emphasizing, "God has someone in mind for our church and we will find each other." Besides Nancy, the other five members of the PNC are Tara Estes, Marsha Jeffries, Sid Long, Eve Oliphant, and Steve Worthern. A non-voting member is Rev. Bill McGuinness, our Presbytery Liaison.



Deacons are again putting together a Holiday Gift Bag for twenty four friends at Hospitality House. These Thanksgiving care packages include hand knit scarf and stocking caps, socks for men, women and children, \$10 gift card for a meal at McDonalds, hand sanitizers. Thank you Vicki for making a small card for each bag explaining these gifts are from the First Presbyterian Church of Fort Bragg.

These holiday gift bags plus the hearty bean casserole made once a month for Hospitality House are obvious ways we carry out the traditional mission of Deacons: "to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless and any who may be in distress."

The Deacons have stuffed "food bags" to hand out to the homeless. These bags are available in the social hall after worship. One recent e-mail we received said: "Dear Deacons, We just finished walking our dog, Bella at Pomo Bluffs and stopped by the college to walk around. That's when we met Kevin and his dog Bishop. Kevin is recently homeless and using his bike and bike trailer for transportation and storing his things. After talking with him for a while and letting Bella interact with Bishop, we gave him the care bag from the Church and some dog treats that we had in the car. We really enjoyed our conversation and hearing his story. He was most appreciative of our generosity on behalf of the church. We reminded him of the community Thanksgiving meal and he said he attended it last year and plans to go again. Our thanks to the Deacon team for giving us a way to connect with and provide a little assistance to Kevin and Bishop."




#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

Session met October 17th. Here are some of the highlights:

- •After worship on October 28, there will be the Blessing of the Animals
- Communion will be moved from November 4th to November 11th
- November session meeting moved from November 21st to November 14th because it is so close to Thanksgiving
- Preparations for Thanksgiving Community Dinner will be Tuesday and Wednesday, November 20th and 21st
- Wednesdays December 5th, 12th and 19th will be ADVENT midweek dates at 6:00 p.m. Theme is "Silent Night".
- Session voted to send budgeted Mission funds in the amount of \$1,200 each to Presbyterian
  Disaster Aid for hurricanes Florence, Michael, and Mangkhut and to Habitat for Humanity in Santa
  Rosa to help victims of the wildfires.
- Pastor Cheryl will be out of the office October 29th through November 6th on Study Leave at a CREDO conference.
- Whether or not to host the Texas 4000 in July, 2019 was tabled until the November meeting.
